Do you ever feel that your children know more about online technologies than you do?

You're not alone. The Internet and online technologies are an important part of children's lives at home and school, providing great opportunities for learning, communicating, playing and creating. SID 2012 will be taking place on **Tuesday 7 February** with activities across the UK and beyond which we would like you to be a part of.

The **Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOP)** is the UK's national centre dedicated to protecting children from harm both online and offline. **CEOP's Thinkuknow** education initiative aims to **empower children and young people to enjoy online technologies safely**. Each year CEOP celebrates SID to highlight the importance of educating children and young people about their online safety.

It is just as important to be involved in your children's life online, than it is offline. Just as you would ask about their friends at school or the clubs they go to, you should use this approach with the people they meet online – ask the same questions and show the same interest.

To help get you started, CEOP are releasing the **'Parents' and Carers' Guide to the Internet'** - a short, entertaining TV-style programme looking at what it's like to bring up children in the online world. The programme will help you to:

- stay up-to-date with the technology your children are using;
- understand steps you can take to keep your children safe online; and
- know what action to take and where to seek further support if things go wrong.

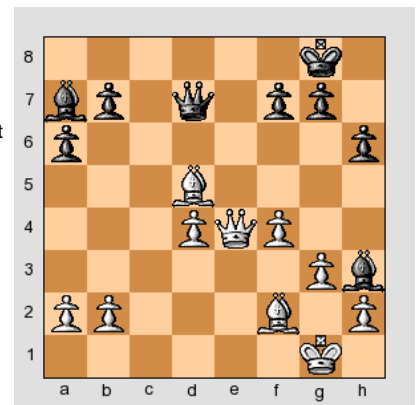

Chris Robshaw, New England Rugby Captain and Ex-Millfield Prep Star

It was a proud moment for Millfield Prep and Millfield Senior School this week when Chris Robshaw was chosen to captain the England rugby team during the first two games of the 2012 Six Nations.

Chris arrived at Millfield Prep in 1996 as a Year 6 pupil and continued through the School, leaving Millfield with 3 A-levels in 2004.

"Chris was totally dedicated to his rugby whether it was in training or in our matches. He always led by example and gave nothing less than 100% effort" said **Mr Dave Hill**, Chris's coach here at Millfield Prep.

"He was absolutely fearless. He was always the first at the breakdown and he never missed a tackle. From an early age he quickly established himself as a player of immense promise."

Five other former Preparatory pupils, currently Millfield Senior School players, will be hoping to emulate Chris by playing international rugby in the near future.

Tom Bellak and James Bloxham both played for England U18s against Wales recently, with Max Northcote-Green and Tom Ellis hoping to join their schoolmates, while Robbie Tait eyes selection for Scotland in the same age group.

Chris Robshaw: His Millfield Prep History

Some of Chris's former Prep teachers and sports coaches, share their fond memories:

Brian West, British Lions and former 1st team coach and Director of Sport, Millfield Prep notes, "I remember Chris as a huge U13 centre, who was ferocious in the tackle and devastating with the ball in hand. Typically a mature 13 year old who ruined the game (at least for the opposition). He always wanted to play in the forwards but playing in the centre was good for his development. He went on to play prop at Millfield Senior School."

Mr Simon Wynn recalls, "As a Year 6 his rugby prowess was obvious and I coached him in his first year of 15-a-side rugby as a Year 7 pupil, when he was in the Under 12 XV in 1997. That side was very successful, winning 11 out of 12 matches and a sevens tournament at Wellington.

Chris played at No. 8 or as a flanker and was captain of the team. He did indeed lead by

example. During that season he scored more than 15 tries – more than any other player.

In a tight match against Clifton he took responsibility to call a line out move that we had only just begun to learn and it came off perfectly to result in a match-winning try.

He was also a good hockey player and athlete, though a 'rustic' cricketer."

Mrs Shayler recalls her time teaching Chris at Millfield Senior School. "He was a super boy. I taught him GCSE Biology at the Senior School and ironically, in my class, he sat beside Oli Morgan another England rugby player and they were both extremely hard working."

Mr and Mrs Evans remember him well as they were his long-suffering house parents during his time here. From the moment he walked into the house as a Year 6, Mr Evans knew he was a leader. He led his friends in the annual water fight and paintball fights, which of course, they won. "He was an animal!" declares Mr Evans.

Chris and his 'artful dodger' friend Henry Sands, drove Mr and Mrs Evans "to insanity" on many occasions, as they never knew what they would get up to next. There was the quick trip up to the top of Glastonbury Tor, thinking that no-one would ever know and of course, the cheeky visit to the girls' boarding house... Henry was the smoother of the two apparently, but Chris no doubt enjoyed their adventures!

Mr Evans was honoured to be presented with Chris's first England international shirt—currently hanging in Champion House (and still covered in mud from the game).

Although rugby was his first love, Chris knew that he had to work hard to achieve academically. This he did, as Mr Evans recalls seeing his work space covered in hundreds of yellow Post-It notes, helping him with his studies.

Explore Day 7 February 2012

We have a day packed with outdoor activities for our second Explore Day of the academic year. All children will need waterproof clothing, wellingtons, hats, scarves, gloves and extra socks. We will be working outside all day unless the weather is particularly bad, so additional clothing is vitally important.



The children will be grouped into five mixed age working groups – Pre-School to Year 2

– the groups are named after familiar trees – holly, oak, horse chestnut, hawthorn and beech. Activities include making nesting boxes, planting a hazel hedge, building a willow den, creating natural mobiles and designing and making bug homes. We will be working in 'Orchard Mews' an orchard behind St. Andrew's Chapel which we aim to develop as an outdoor learning area for use by both the Pre-Prep and the rest of the School. In the long term, we plan to have a bread oven, compost toilet and outdoor classroom.
